

# Framework for Phased Return to School

## Guiding Principles

#### Health and Safety Comes First

TAS takes the responsibility of the health and safety of our faculty, staff and students very seriously. A safe return to campus is our top priority.

#### **Follow the Science**

TAS' guidelines for a phased return to campus are informed by:

- Data, including TAS' specifics
- CDC recommendations
- California Department of Public Health & LA County Department of Public Health
- Advice of medical experts.

#### Take a Measured Approach

TAS has designed a school re-entry plan that uses a tiered process to allow faculty, staff, students to adapt to a return to campus in smaller increments

# Role of the Entire TAS Community

Follow public health guidelines	Avoid crowds	Wear a face mask when you leave the house	Stay at least 6 feet away from others not in your household
Wash hands frequently with soap and water	Stay home if sick or exposed	Get tested if you are concerned about symptoms or exposure	Communicate if you have questions or concerns




# New Health and Safety Measures

### New Policies & Procedures

- Symptom and temperature checks upon entry to campus.
- Masks must be worn at all times.
- Regular COVID-19 testing.
- No visitors allowed on campus.






### Health Upgrades to Campus

 Upgraded HVAC filters to filter out 99.9% of air contaminants.

- for one-on-one assessments and room dividers.
- Handwashing stations.
- Tents for outdoor instruction.

Classroom Safety Measures

- Reduced classroom capacity.
- Six feet of separation between seats in classrooms.
- Frequent disinfection of common area surfaces.
- Windows and classroom doors open whenever possible for ventilation.
- Reduced shared used of equipment and materials.
- Electrostatic classroom cleaning.





Additional Safety Measures

- Pivot group indoor activities, such as meetings, to outdoors.
- Limit adult to adult conversations to less than 15 minutes indoors with masks on.
- When more than one person is in the classroom, doors and windows will be left open.



## Testing and Contract Tracing





Required COVID-19 testing on a rotating basis every week for all faculty, staff and students



Established protocols to triage any COVID-19 cases



All faculty and staff are highly encouraged to receive COVID-19 vaccine


